
## **GWCO Gives Back!**

### \$1.4 Million Dollars in Non-Dues Revenue to the Optometry Family

The Great Western Council of Optometry (GWCO) is a non-profit association formed in 1991 as a vehicle to provide a common voice for members within organized optometry, facilitate communication, enhance professional development and provide financial support to affiliated state optometric associations.

Today, GWCO is comprised of thirteen member states including; Alaska, Arizona, California, Colorado, Hawaii, Idaho, Montana, Nevada, New Mexico, Oregon, Utah, Wyoming, and Washington. A Representative from each state makes up the GWCO Board of Directors.

In order to provide financial support to GWCO member states, all after-expense revenue, raised through support of GWCO, is given back to member states each year. Since 1997, that has meant more than \$1.4 million dollars in non-dues revenue to member state optometric associations.


